Would you like to study in the United States?

Committee of J. W. Fulbright is an american-czech organisation that supports educational and cultural exchange between the Czech republic and the United States. They provide information and consulting about the scholarships they offer and their services. This committee can be useful not only for the Czech people, but for the American students/teachers as well that want to study/teach here.



Scholarships they offer usually cover the costs of living, return plane ticket, health insurance and sometimes even the school costs. But in order to apply for the scholarship, you have to have czech citizenship, bachelor's degree and a good english knowledge.

There's also a possibility of going to a *summer school*, meaning it's not that big of a commitment and you'll only be gone for the summer. The destination is in the Michigan State University and in order to apply, you have to be 18 years or older.

A part of the Fulbrights committee is also a help center EducationUSA. They offer free consultation about the possibilities of studying in the United States.

BASIC INFORMATION

The Super Bowl is the annual league championship game of the National Football League (NFL) of the United States. It has served as the final game of every NFL season since 1966.



The game is played on the second Sunday in February. And the prize is a Super Bowl trophy and around \$160,000 per person.

THIS YEAR'S GAME

It took place in Allegiant Stadium, Las Vegas. The match was between the Kansas City Chiefs (winners) and the San Francisco 49ers (losers). It was the third time that the Chiefs won in the last 5 years.



THE HALF TIME SHOW

Early Super Bowls featured a halftime show consisting of marching bands from local colleges or high schools; but as the popularity of the game increased, popular singers and musicians performed during its pre-game ceremonies and the halftime show.



This year's performer was Usher, who brought on stage many other guests, including Alicia Keys, Post Malone and others.

The most watched half time show was last year's Rihanna's performance (121 million people).

CELEBRITIES AT SUPER BOWL

The biggest celebrity there was Taylor Swift supporting her boyfriend Travis Kelce who plays for the Kansas City Chiefs. Hanging out



with Taylor was Ice Spice, Blake Lively and Lana del Rey. Other celebrities at the Super Bowl were Beyoncé and JAY-Z, Lady Gaga, Justin and Hailey Bieber, Kim Kardashian, Ariana Grande, and many others.

WOMEN WHO CHANGED THE WORLD

In honor of celebrating International Women's day we prepared an article introducing women that helped to make the world a better place.

Marie Curie (1867-1934) was a physicist and chemist, known for her research with her husband Pierre Curie in the fields of radioactivity and nuclear physics. Born in Warsaw, Poland, as Maria Skłodowska, she later adopted the name Marie after moving to France.



Marie Curie was the first woman to win a Nobel Prize and remains the only person to have won Nobel Prizes in two different scientific fields.

Radium, one of the elements Marie Curie discovered, was used in early cancer treatments. Her research paved the way for advancements in radiation therapy, revolutionizing medical science and saving countless lives.

Rosa Parks (1913-2005) was an African American living in Montgomery, Alabama. In 1955 she challenged the race segregation that existed in parts of the US by refusing to give up her seat on a bus so that a white person could sit down. Her protest was supported by many other African Americans and alerted the civil rights movement.

Rosa Parks received numerous awards and honors for her contributions to the civil rights movement. She co-founded the Rosa and Raymond Parks Institute for Self-Development, which aimed to inspire and motivate young people toward self-improvement and higher education.



Four years after her death in 2005, Barack Obama became the first African American US president.

Emmeline Pankhurst (1858-1928) was a political activist in the UK. She played a key role in achieving voting rights for women.



Pankhurst was arrested numerous times for her activism. She was subjected to force-feeding while on hunger strikes in prison, that garnered public outrage and brought attention to the suffragette (women's activist organisation) cause.

Her dedication brought attention to the cause and helped pave the way for future advancements in women's rights. She passed away on June 14, 1928, shortly after the extension of voting rights to all women over the age of 21 in the UK.

Amelia Earhart (1897-1937) was an inspiration to many women to pursue careers in aviation.

When she was 25 she broke the women's altitude record. In 1932 she became the first woman to fly solo across the Atlantic. Over the next few years she continued to break speed and flying records.

In June 1937 she began a flight around the world becoming the first person to fly from the Red Sea to India. She was reported missing near Howland Island in the Pacific. Her disappearance is one of history's unsolved mysteries.



Mother Theresa (1910-1997) was a Roman Catholic nun who lived in India for most of her life.



In 1950 she founded the Missionaries of Charity which attracted many sisters who took vows to help the poorest of the poor. Their work in over 130 countries included managing homes for people who were dying, soup kitchens, orphanages and schools.

Her charitable work changed the lives of many of the most vulnerable people in the world.

Diana Spencer, Princess of Wales (1961-1997) became the first wife of the current king of the British throne Charles the III.

Princess Diana became well known internationally for her charity work for sick children, the banning of landmines and raising awareness about those affected by cancer, HIV/AIDS and mental illness.

She was and still is an inspiration for many people. Although some could have found her public appearances controversial, because of her sense of style, wearing pants, short dresses, sneakers etc.



These are just a few examples of many inspirational women across the world who made history.
